The Tower of Life by Chana Stiefel is in the Education for Mission group and would be familiar to you if you have visited the Holocaust Museum in Washington DC. Yaffa Eliach was asked to serve on President Jimmy Carter's Commission on the Holocaust. After visiting former death camps, she was determined to return beauty and grace to the victims of the Holocaust by sharing pictures of descendants of her hometown, Eishyshok. Her grandmother had taken many photographs of the town residents and Yaffa tracked these photos down assembling them into the Tower of Life or "Tower of Faces" as seen in the Holocaust Museum in Washington DC. Remember that either of these Children's Books can qualify for a Reading Program book and you can also share the book with a child or grandchild to help them understand moments of our history.


